THE PLAY

In July 2015, *The Watershed* will have its World Premiere as part of the Pan Am/Parapan Am Games in Toronto. Set in Canada between 2012 and 2014, it is a documentary play about an artist, a family and a Country struggling between two seemingly irreconcilable goals: steady economic growth and sound environmental stewardship.

THE STORY

The Watershed is about a family who encounters firsthand the plight of evidence-based scientists in Canada, our current government's apparent "War On Science", and its startling implications for our national identity and future. The play asks: What kind of Canada will our children inherit, and do we still have a say in the matter?

The Watershed unfolds as a theatrical documentary

Largely constructed from original interviews conducted by Canada's foremost documentary theatre writer (Annabel Soutar), the play puts on stage a multiplicity of ideological perspectives and conflicting visions for our country's natural resources. The sum of these voices makes one thing abundantly clear: a contemporary play about water in Canada must also be about oil.

Annabel includes and implicates her own family in the story — a journey populated by encounters with some of the world's great freshwater scientists, some of our country's fiercest environmental activists, and impassioned individuals engaging in our burgeoning oil sector. The playwright also makes every attempt to include the voices of our country's conservative constituents.

Background and Development

In 2012, Porte Parole (Montreal) and Crow's Theatre (Toronto) premiered *SEEDS*, a gripping docudrama about food sustainability that chronicles the epic showdown between farmer Percy Schmeiser and Monsanto Inc. Critically acclaimed, *SEEDS* toured across Canada for two years, and will tour several cities in the U.S. in 2016-2017.

Based on that success, the Arts and Culture Program of the Toronto 2015 Pan Am/ Parapan Am Games commissioned Crow's Theatre and Porte Parole to create a documentary play about freshwater sustainability.
